Trainings & Outreach Activities

Each year, Prevent Child Abuse Nevada (PCANV) staff attends a variety of community events to collaborate with other community organizations, build awareness on relevant topics such as positive parenting, anti-bullying tips, internet safety, and reducing stress. This year, PCANV attended a total of 36 events, which included back to school fairs, fall and spring carnivals, conferences, and several holiday celebrations.

PCANV staff offer 10 different trainings for professionals and parents on strategies to support the well-being of children in our communities. This year PCANV was able to provide 69 trainings statewide involving 385 providers and 362 parents.

Taskforce on Prevention of the Sexual Abuse of Children


The Nevada Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children studies and identifies strategies, goals, and recommendations for preventing child sexual abuse. Staff at PCANV help to organize and provide support for the Task Force. This year, members of the Task Force continue working with the Nevada Department of Education to enhance capacity within each school district to implement curriculum standards that better protect the students in the state. Parent Advisory Group

This year PCANV was able to create a Parent Advisory Group. The group meets on a monthly basis and consist of 7 members across the state of Nevada. This group of parents, guardians and caregiver have provided guidance and feedback on programs and materials that will help strengthen prevention efforts in Nevada. Recently the group finished updating the Parents Guide to Apps as well as participated in the Positive Parenting Program trainings we offer.

Biannual Webinar

Each year PCANV strives to provide community members with up-to-date information and resources by hosting two webinars. This year's first webinar was held in January, presented by Megan Jones from Social Entrepreneurs who presented on the implementation in Nevada of the new 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline. The second webinar was held in April by the National Native Children's Trauma Center at the University of Montana. Presenters Alan Rabideau and Kimee Wind-Hummingbird gave the presentation "Engaging Indigenous Families and Communities".





Pinwheels for Prevention

Prevent Child Abuse America Pinwheels for Prevention® campaign is an effort to change the way the nation thinks about prevention and introduce how everyone can deliver on their commitment to America's children. The blue pinwheel is meant to be an uplifting reminder of childhoods and the bright future all children deserve. The 2022 "Pinwheels for Prevention" activities were a statewide success! Overall, 11 counties reported their participation **APPROXIMATELY** 74 **PINWHEELS FOR PREVENTION EVENTS**, involving school teachers, organizations, children and parents either planting pinwheel in the parks, courthouse lawns, or displaying them and sharing the pinwheel message.
